COMMUNITY CENTER MEETING UPDATE:

A ZANC community meeting was held on Aug 30, 2015 to discuss updates to the situation at the existing Dar-e Mehr and to launch a Capital Campaign for a new **Bay Area Zarathushti Community Center**. The event was well attended with over 50 people in attendance. The formal presentation focused on why a new Center had become necessary and what it would take to make the vision a reality.

"If you build it, they will come" was the general tone of the presentation. Examples of other Zoroastrian Centers in North America were presented, where youth and adult participation increased dramatically after a new center was founded. The attendees at the meeting were urged to look to the future, to a sense of community and identity.

We need a community center where we can meet for events, classes and other youth activities and host educational & religious programs. We can get there by buying a church or commercial unit (like the India Community Center) with the appropriate zoning. Alternatively, we can buy land that is appropriately zoned and design a new building.

We have looked at a few properties in the last few months and have found that we will need an approximate budget of \$3 million to be serious buyers in the Bay Area market. We have so far collected about \$55,000 from our initial fund raising effort a year ago. The capital campaign committee is working on ideas for fund raising events and is actively looking for ideas and volunteers. They have also proposed donation levels and ways in which donors will be recognized. *All donations made for a new community center are kept in a separate account and will not be comingled with ZANC general funds.*

A lively question and answer session followed the formal presentation. Several questions focused on our options with the existing Dar-e Mehr. The Committee had consulted a real estate lawyer and the definitive conclusion was that there is no way to stay at the present location. Firstly, the zoning is only for a single family home and the County will not change that. Secondly, a large part of our existing structures are not to code, including the Atash Kadeh which would have to be brought into compliance. Thirdly, we would have to re-grade the road and fourthly, arrange for water and sewage compliance. After all these prohibitively expensive changes, the County could still refuse to let us operate as a community center because they do not plan to change the rural residential zoning.

People had many questions about ways in which they could donate money. Several options are listed on the pledge form that was passed out (and is included with this newsletter)*. If anyone wishes to donate using a different option, the committee will try to make it happen. The meeting closed on an optimistic note with many pledge forms being filled out and returned.

New Bay Area Zarathushti Community Center

As many of you know, use of the current Dar-e Mehr is restricted to small groups for the foreseeable future. We continue to hold Sunday school classes there and we can have small meetings there. However, large gatherings can no longer be held there due to permit, access and zoning issues.

Faced with this reality, we need to raise funds to buy another property that can serve as a new Bay Area Zarathushti Community Center. After considerable evaluation we have established that the property would need to accommodate:

1. A Community Center of the size we currently rent to hold our large meetings, with a capacity of (say) 350-400 persons.

- 2. The property would have to be zoned Commercial.
- 3. A Sanctuary, preferably adjacent to the main room.
- 4. 3-4 classrooms.
- 5. Library.
- 6. Game room.
- 7. Kitchen.
- 8. Bathrooms.
- 9. Parking for 150-200 cars.

- If the property is located in a neighborhood zoned 'Commercial' we may be able to avail of overflow parking in adjacent properties on weekends.

- It would be desirable to be located close to mass transit.

- It would be desirable for the property to be rentable for weddings or other functions to community members or outsiders. This would provide some ongoing income for the maintenance of the facility.

A preliminary estimate of the funds needed for such a property is in the range \$2-3 million. This is a considerable challenge, but not insurmountable with consistent fund raising efforts. All money raised will be set aside in a separate Community Center fund for this specified purpose until we have enough money to move on a purchase. We feel we will need to collect at least \$1 million before we can seriously start to search for a suitable property. We will recognize all donors of \$1000 or more on a contribution wall in the new facility.

The approximate geographical location of the property is an important consideration. Given the size of the Bay Area and the scattered nature of the Zoroastrian population it is difficult to identify a location convenient to all. Also to be considered is the relative cost of Real Estate in different parts of the Bay Area. Broadly speaking, a location in the East Bay from the current Dar-e Mehr north to Hayward might be most convenient to the greatest number at the most reasonable price.

Nazneen & Ehler Spliedt, Erach Tarapore, Adil Engineer and Bomi Patel are heading efforts to develop an infrastructure and lay a foundation so we can achieve this goal



Cyrus the Great lived 599-529 BCE and ruled 559-529 BCE.
